• Presidential Update - Ayana is stepping down as president at the end of this month. The reason is that she feels the need to take more personal time. Ayana will be on a sabbatical until the end of the year.

Ayana provided some copies of the bylaws for people to reference.

"Section 8. Should any position become available prior to the regularly held elections, the position will be filled by special election held amongst the Executive Committee (see Article VII, Section 1 for details regarding the Executive Committee), two-thirds of which must be present for the election to be valid."

The plan is for the June EC meeting to be public. Ayana is trying to work with Kipp. Two possible dates are 6/24/15 or 6/30/15.

Article 7, section 1: Gives the duties of the officer.

Under Elections, it indicates elections will be held in December. The bylaws aren't clear on who can run for president. Section 7 says officers must be residents, and "voting members", but there are no stipulations on who is a voting member. So any resident can run for president.

Treasurer's Report

Kendal Carey - We have money. For now we should not encur any more expenses until after the Summer Solstice.

Someone asked about expenses we encur:

- John on the beautification
- Newsletter
- The garden normally has significant expenses
- The youth program
- Solstice costs money to put on

Kyiomi says she was hoping to have neighborhood kids pick up trash during the Solstice and pay them for that.

Ayana noted that the Solstice has traditionally cost around \$1500.

Police / Public Safety

Sgt. Hubbard - Evening watch shift supervisor. Stepping in for Lt. Hunt. Here to get any concerns or issues.

Crime report:

- Homicide: No increase.
- Rape : no increase
- Robbery: No increase
- Ag Assault: 1 more (4)
- Larceny from vehicles: 12 this year vs 2 in 2014
- Larceny not from vehicles: 7 this year vs. 4 in 2014
- No vehicle thefts this month.

Going to be putting more visibility on areas where there is more crime. The hope is to push the crime over more into Fulton County.

Have made some arrests:

- Robberv
- Assault
- Burglary
- Larceny from Auto
- 4 Larceny (other)
- 11 narcotic arrests

- 21 part II crimes (less serious than felonies)
- 27 quality of life crime arrests
- · 3 citations issued for housing code
- 7 arrest warrants served

Any issues or concerns?

J Scott: How does the number of officers in the field for Zone 4 compare to this period in 2014?

Sgt. Hubbard: It evens out. They come and go.

?: There's a situation in the neighborhood regarding dogs getting off leashes. Is there a way to put up posters or something so that we can notify people about what the new law is concerning leaving dogs tethered when you're not at home?

He is going to take that feedback back to his department.

Michelle: Someone asked again about speeding in the neighborhood, particularly on S. Gordon.

Ayana: We had a radar sign up that shows your speed on Rogers for about 8 weeks. That was a significant improvement. If there is any way to get those signs up during the summer, in particular, when the kids are out of school, that would be really good.

He nodded.

Abbey: Is there any type of initiative...

Sgt. Hubbard: The judges and agencies have gotten together to try to come with an alternative to help the people get on a different path when they are released. They are working on coming up with a solution, but it takes time.

Abbey: Can we get any more specifics?

Sgt. Hubbard: I can't comment on that. The judges are the power. We just try to do what we can to make you safe. Our higher echelon is meeting with them and voicing their concerns, but it's up to them to decide when they're going to complete something.

Abbey: How many programs, what other agencies are you working with?

Sgt. Hubbard: The ones taht border the city. Fulton Co Sherrif, Fulton County PD, FUlton County judicial (magistrate, superior courts). All of those entities are working together.

Abbey: Anyone working with drug & alcohol programs, workforce programs, etc.?

Sgt. Hubbard: I don't know; the higher echelons talk to them.

Abbey: A lot of people I've spoken with say that they aren't happy with the fact that the only solution is simply arrests. We are very, very concerned about that. If the next person they send could address that specifically, I would appreciate that.

Ayana: I will add that to the agenda. There's someone here from the state senator's office. Does she have any information?

Gloria Smith from Pat Gardner's office. Abbey asked how hard we are working on programs that deal with the underlying issues of crime. Mental health, drug & alcohol...are there more holistic approaches beyond simply making arrests.

Gloria said there aren't any that she knows of, but she can check with Pat's office and report back.

Still haven't gotten the paperwork back from the FDIC to close on the property. Sherry Bailey is our real estate agent on that. She is in contact with them to try to speed up the process. We have a chance to join with Habersha. They have an urban farmers training program. "Extreme Green Garden Makeover". Their trainees would come to the garden and it would get rebuilt. They would be able to work with the campers as well. We can't move forward with that until we know we have permission to do that, or if we can close before June 10th. We are trusting the process, but we also have a form letter that you can send out to put pressure on the FDIC.

We have also been working in Stokes Park with Ms. Pippy. We're doing this every Saturday.

Also, we have a GoFundMe campaign for the garden. The link is on there on the Westview Neighbor's Facebook page. 8 families in the neighborhood have said they would contribute \$1000 each. We need money to pay them back and to build the garden back. That form letter, by the way, also encourages the FDIC to pay us money back for what they destroyed. Garden beds, picnic tables, etc. It's GoFundMe Westview Garden. So far we have only raised \$100.

Contact him for anything related to community watch, community policing issues, etc. The Neighborhood Watch training has changed. They added more this year. To be a certified neighborhood watch, you have to accumulate points. 50 points for the regular community, 20 or 25 for a senior community. You have to attend training during the year. We just had one in March. There will be another one this month or next month. It will be like an expo. There are a lot of communities where the signs are up but the community isn't active in the Neighborhood Watch program. It's very important for the community to be engaged. I had a neighbor who watched a home being broken into for 30 minutes. You should know your neighbors and their cars.

Darrick asked about the point system. It's based on community cleanup, social event, block party. There is a list of things you can do as a community.

Michael Jones: Asked about the benefit of the point system.

Clarke: It starts with you. The points is to make sure you get involved. Without that, the neighborhood watch would usually go down because there wasn't much community involvement.
