The newsletter is one of the many projects of the WCO. I want to share some of the accomplishments of the WCO from 2013.

Spring: Our Beautification Committee maintains many triangles throughout the community by mowing the grass and planting flowers. Summer: On June 22, 2013 the WCO sponsored the fifth annual Summer Solstice Festival. This annual neighborhood festival brings hundreds of people from all over the city to our neighborhood. The festival features a grill-off competition between southwest Atlanta neighborhoods. This year the festival was covered in the *Atlanta-Journal Constitution*.

Our Development Committee keeps track of all development happening in our area. This past summer we had

The WCO also sponsored a special safety meeting at the August community meeting. City council members, Zone 4 police and code representatives attended the meeting. Our Safety Committee regularly communicates with local officials about crime in our area. The Safety and Special Events Committee also hosted our annual National Night Out on August 6th.

Fall: Every year we have multiple clean-ups sponsored by the Special Events Committee. Our biggest clean-up is in the fall. Ten bags of trash were collected in the November. clean-up. Fall is also an active time in the Westview Community Garden, which is located at 1439 South Gordon Street. Last year the Garden Committee sponsored a rain barrel workshop where neighbors learned how to use and assemble rain barrels. Every participant received a free rain barrel.

Winter: A Westview Angel Tree, sponsored by the Youth Committee, collected presents for needy children in the community. Big Apple Inn, located on RDA, housed the tree. Winter is also the time of our annual Holiday Potluck Lunch sponsored by the Special Events Committee. The lunch happens at Fire Station 17.
