# **PRESERVE HISTORIC HOMES, SAVE THE ENVIRONMENT**

The homes on Ontario, South Gordon, Westwood, Stokes, and Rogers were built in the 1910s and 1920s in what is called the Craftsman Style. The hallmark of this style is the multi pane over single pane window.

Today's wood is cut after only 20 years or so of growth. Old growth wood, that which original windows in Westview are made of, from the early 1900s is much denser and of much greater quality than today's wood so it is adverse to rot, and in almost every instance underneath that cruddy paint and rotted glazing is wood in perfect condition!

One of the arguments used for window replacement is energy efficiency. In fact, heat rises - 80% of heat loss is through the attic. It takes nearly 40-50 years to recoup any energy efficiency gained by putting in new windows. What's more, a \$75 dollar storm window over an original window provides equal the energy efficiency of a replacement window which costs hundreds of dollars. For a better return on investment, instead put 8 inches of blow-in insulation in your attic.

Replacement windows are made of toxic plastic. The typical life span is 20-25 years; and you have to replace the whole window, not just the glass like you can with an original window. Most important, original windows retain the unique historic beauty of your home. Historic resources are a catalyst for economic revitalization. Compromising their integrity by removing their original windows results in the house looking like many other homes in the metro area, taking away that which makes our neighborhood unique.

Storm windows can be purchased at any of the Home Centers. Some on-line businesses also sell custom made *interior* storm windows that are held in place by magnets. If your original windows need restoration, simple tutorials on how to restore your original windows are available on the internet. It takes some time, but it is surprisingly easy and much cheaper than buying new windows. In addition, there are numerous businesses in Atlanta that will restore your windows for you at rates comparable to window replacement.

## **DEVELOPMENT NEWS**

The Westview Community Organization's Development Committee has been kept busy during the second half of 2014 as many development-related activities in Westview and southwest Atlanta are abuzz.

#### Infrastructure Bond Referendum

The City of Atlanta has determined that a \$1 billion infrastructure project backlog currently exists. In an effort to address at least part of the backlog they are proposing a \$250 million bond. In June and September citizens were able to provide input on which projects they would like to address in their neighborhoods. City Council will vote on the final list before voters head to the polls in March 2015 to approve or reject the bond.

Members of the Westview Community Organization showed up in numbers to let their voices be heard and encourage city employees and council members to include projects outlined in the Westview Master Plan (adopted by City Council in 2011). Requested priority projects included streetscape and sidewalk improvements along Ralph D. Abernathy Blvd. (near Lucile Avenue) in the Westview Village, along Cascade Avenue, along Langhorn Street, and along Beecher Street.

#### **Atlanta BeltLine**

Westview is seeing a lot of activity related to the Atlanta BeltLine.

In 2013 the Atlanta BeltLine was awarded a federal \$18 million TIGER V grant, allowing them to combine the grant with private funds to move forward with the construction of a \$43 million trail in southwest Atlanta. Over the course of 2013 and 2014 the Atlanta BeltLine held public meetings where citizens were able to provide input regarding the Westside Trail.

The trail, which will run from Washington Park to Adair Park, will be similar to the popular Eastside Trail and will feature a 14-foot wide concrete multi-use trail, pedestrian lighting, security cameras, landscaping, retaining walls, 14 access points, and important infrastructure required for the future transit component.

Mayor Kasim Reed, Atlanta BeltLine, Inc. and the Atlanta BeltLine Partnership held a groundbreaking ceremony in Adair Park on November 12th, which marked the kick off to the two-year trail construction period.

Additionally, planning meetings for the transit portion of the Atlanta BeltLine project took place in September and October. The meetings covered various options for the train to connect to either the West End or Oakland City MARTA stations. Per the Strategic Implementation Plan the Atlanta BeltLine transit construction in SW Atlanta is set to begin before 2018.

#### **Historic Gordon Street Presbyterian Church**

The historic Gordon Street Presbyterian Church at the corner of Ralph David Abernathy Blvd and Stokes Avenue has gone through a number of foreclosures over the last several years, sitting empty for long periods of time.

The former church will now see a breath of fresh air as Kim King Associates has acquired the building and is in the process of renovating it. The former Sunday school building will be turned into office space, bringing further economic development into the Westview neighborhood.

The King family has close ties back to the West End/Westview area. As a child, Kim King grew up a block south of Westview on Westhaven Drive. He was a Georgia Tech football star in the 1960s before starting his development firm, King King Associates. After losing a battle with leukemia, his children, who now run King King Associates, started the Kim King Foundation, which provides educational support and opportunities for children in the greater West End area.
